






Fig. 4 - Maximum Average Forward Current Vs. Allowable Lead Temperature




Fig. 5 - Maximum Average Forward Dissipation Vs. Average Forward Current






Fig. 6-Maximum Peak Surge Forward Current Vs. Pulse Duration




